Visual Metaphor

Metaphor: a figure of speech in which a word or phrase literally denoting one kind of object or idea is used in place of another to suggest a likeness or analogy between them (Merriam-Webster). Thing A is Thing B. It's a bridge from the familiar to the unknown.

Apply these new words to other categories (nature, food, animals, objects, occupations) to find something that's familiar to people that will act as the bridge to your data. Test your sketches!
